Dear Parents/Carers,

I hope that you all had a good half term.

A couple of questions came up at the FOBS AGM when parents were discussing priorities for spending and I thought it worth sharing my responses with all parents.

It seems like a long time ago now, but our summer was hot and a question was raised about why we don't have ceiling fans in Lake. The answer is down to the fact that the ceiling is a false one, so to install ceiling fans would be a very expensive job and the staff report that neither they nor the pupils struggle with the heat sufficiently to warrant spending money on this. The doors are nearly always open and most of the time there is a pleasant breeze in the classroom.

School meals were also discussed, the fact that we only have a small kitchen, not large enough for cooking from scratch and whether or not funding from FOBS could remedy this. The kitchens in West Sussex are not full production kitchens, this was a council decision 20 years ago to remove the catering facilities from their primary schools. Back in 2016, small finishing kitchens were installed to allow a hot meal service to take place, but the food is made off site and delivered in daily to be steamed and served. Unfortunately, even if we had enough money to purchase the appliances and resources needed for a "cook from scratch kitchen" we simply do not have the space within our current

building. Being part of an academy may open up new possibilities in the future, if this were to be considered a priority for our school and/or the academy as a whole.

Another topic of conversation concerned offering support to families who struggle to pay for trips and activities. We always offer this support to parents, with letters about trips encouraging anyone in this position to come and talk to us. The FOBS also have a small pot of money put aside each year to help subsidise activities for children if parents are unable to contribute.

The topic of musical instrument lessons was also discussed, with parents wanting more group lessons. Unfortunately, this is beyond our control as the lessons are provided by West Sussex Music Service. Should the service notify us of their wish to offer group lessons, this is something that we would certainly accommodate if we can.

During this year, it is our intention to install several new canopies to enable better use of our outside space. At the meeting, a parent questioned as to whether canopies by the roadside might trap air pollution and therefore be unsafe. Having contacted the company who will be installing them and asked this direct question, they have assured us that there is no evidence that this has been the case in any of the installations they have carried out. The canopies have open sides and are tall enough to ensure good circulation.

Finally, a parent suggested that it would be good to offer our pupils more opportunities in Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths (STEM), particularly an after school club. Research already carried out to try and source such a club has been unsuccessful, due to the number of pupils needed to make the club financially viable for outside providers, but it is something that we would love to offer. If you know anyone who could help us in this area, please do let us know. In the meantime, we will keep searching.

### **REMINDER**

#### **Pupil Premium**

If you are on a low income making a FSM application can greatly benefit your child.

It is often thought that parents of children in KS1 who currently receive Universal Free School Meals do not need to make a Free School Meals Application for the school to receive Pupil Premium. THIS IS NOT THE CASE.

Please contact the office if you think you may be eligible for Pupil Premium funding. Any accepted applications for Free School Meals (whether or not your child takes the meal up) attract over £1300 per child per year which the school can use to greatly enhance the resources available for your child both within the classroom and for extra-curricular activities. We may be able to help with school uniform costs, trips and other extra-curricular activities like swimming and music tuition.
